

RULES FOR UAW LOCAL 31 / VICTOR ARMSTRONG SCHOLARSHIP

1. Three (3) Five Hundred Dollar (\$500) scholarships will be awarded for the 2010 Program.
2. Interested parties should contact Local 31 for rules and applications. Applications must be picked up at the Union Hall or the north or south entrances. You may also download from the website.
3. Only children or legal dependents under the age of 25 of UAW Local 31 active and retired Members in good standing are eligible.
4. All applicants will be assigned a control number/ticket.
5. Applications require relevant scholastic information, grade point average, class standing, current grade level, awards, etc.
6. Graduating high school seniors and above are eligible for the UAW Local 31 / Victor Armstrong scholarship.
7. A minimum grade point average of 2.0 cumulative for graduating high school seniors, and 2.0 for college level applicants represent minimum standards. This scholarship is for full time scholastic students taking twelve (12) credit hours or more per semester. Trade School and Vocational Technical students are also eligible. Programs less than two semesters (one year) in the Vo-Tech areas are subject to the Education Committee's evaluation and discretion. Non-degree or non-certification-seeking students are not eligible.
8. Application period opens March 31, 2010 and closes May 17, 2010 at 4:30 p.m.
NO EXCEPTIONS.
9. The applications will be checked for adherence to all rules. A notarized statement allowing the UAW Education Committee to verify grades, etc. will be included with application - this must be returned with the application. This statement must also be signed by parents if student is under age 18 and a minimum of 350 word essay topic, *"How Unions have effected my life."*
10. Winners will be notified after all eligibility and scholastic requirements have been satisfied.
11. The scholarship monies will then be forwarded to the chosen institution. Should the winner decide for any reason not to attend this institution, the UAW Local 31 Financial Secretary must be notified of this change. The new school will then be notified and appropriate arrangements made.
12. Failure to adhere to these rules will result in forfeiture of the award, and the UAW Education Committee's decision will be final.
13. All applicants may reapply again in the next academic year. This is a one (1) semester scholarship only.
14. Winners will be selected by a chance lottery.
15. The three winners that will be selected through this process and will be notified by mail, and/or presented by the membership of Local 31.
